

Privacy Notice

How we use member, trustee, governor and governance professional information

The categories of governance information that we process include:

- personal identifiers, contacts and characteristics (such as name, date of birth, address and contact details, emergency contact)
- DBS disclosure record to include DBS number
- governance details (such as role, start and end dates

Why we collect and use governance information

The personal data collected is essential, in order for the academy or academy trust to fulfil their official functions and meet legal requirements.

We collect and use governance information, for the following purposes:

- a) to meet the statutory duties placed upon us
- b) ensure that all correspondence in relation to meetings and governor duties are provided in accordance the Governance Framework.

Under the <u>UK General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) 2018</u>, the legal basis we rely on for processing personal information for general purposes are:

Article 6 (1) (c). "processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation to which the controller is subject" and 6 (1) (e) - processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller.

All Academy trusts, under the <u>Academies Trust Handbook</u> have a legal duty to provide the governance information as detailed above.

In addition, concerning any special category data we rely on Article 9 (2) (a) the data subject has given explicit consent to the processing of those personal data for one or more specified purposes, and 9 (2) (c) To protect the vital interests of the individual.

Collecting governance information

We collect personal information via governor contact forms and data verification exercises undertaken periodically.

Governance roles data is essential for the academy or academy trust's operational use. Whilst the majority of personal information you provide to us is mandatory, some of it may be requested on a voluntary basis. In order to comply with UK GDPR, we will inform you at the point of collection, whether you are required to provide certain information to us or if you have a choice in this.

Storing governance information

We hold data securely for the set amount of time shown in our data retention schedule. Who we share governance information with

We routinely share this information with:

- the Department for Education (DfE)
- Diocese
- National Governance Association
- Trust/School Office
- Companies House (Trust Board only)
- Disclosure and Barring Service
- Other Trustees/governors on the same Governing Committee or in the Collaborative Learning Trust

Why we share governance information.

We do not share information about individuals in governance roles with anyone without consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

Department for Education (DfE)

The Department for Education (DfE) collects personal data from educational providers and local authorities. We are required to share information about individuals in governance roles with the Department for Education (DfE), under section 538 of the Education Act 1996

We are required to share information about individuals in governance roles with the Department for Education (DfE) under the requirements set out in the <u>Academies</u> Trust Handbook

All data is entered manually on the GIAS service and held by the Department for Education (DfE) under a combination of software and hardware controls which meet the current government security policy framework.

National Governance Association (NGA)

In order to access the NGA website and receive updates, it is necessary for the NGA to have email names and email addresses. In order for the governance professional to pass on email details to the NGA, a member, trustee or governor will be required to give informed and positive consent. An individual can unsubscribe at any time.

Governor Hub

Papers such as minutes, agendas, supporting documents for meetings are managed through Governor Hub, ensuring that it is not necessary for individuals to hold these papers on personal electronic devices.

School Office

In case of emergency or an Ofsted inspection, it is necessary for the central/school office to hold details of any individuals involved on the governance of the Trust.

Other members, trustees, governors, governance professionals on the same Governing Board/Trust

For ease of communication, and if appropriate, contact details may be shared with other members, trustees/governors on the same board or in the same Trust.

Companies House (Trust Board)

In accordance with Sections 167 & 167D of the Companies Act 2006 anyone on the Trust Board must be registered with Companies House as you are a Director of the Company.

Disclosure and Barring Service

All members, trustees and individuals are required to have an enhanced criminal records certificate from the DBS. Further details on DBS checks in schools are within the statutory guidance Keeping Children Safe in Education (KCSIE).

Requesting access to your personal data

Under data protection legislation, you have the right to request access to information about you that we hold. To make a request for your personal information, contact Nicola Lunn at nicola.lunn@collaborativelearningtrust.co.uk.

You also have the right to:

- ask us for access to information about you that we hold
- have your personal data rectified if it is inaccurate or incomplete
- request the deletion or removal of personal data where there is no compelling reason for its continued processing
- restrict our processing of your personal data (i.e., permitting its storage but no further processing)
- object to direct marketing (including profiling) and processing for the purposes of scientific/historical research and statistics
- not be subject to decisions based purely on automated processing where it produces a legal or similarly significant effect on you

If you have a concern or complaint about the way we are collecting or using your personal data, you should raise your concern with us in the first instance or directly to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) at Information Commissioner's Office.

Withdrawal of consent and the right to lodge a complaint

How government uses your data

The governance data that we lawfully share with the Department for Education (DfE) via GIAS will:

- increase the transparency of governance arrangements
- enable academies, academy trusts and the Department for Education (DfE) to identify more quickly and accurately individuals who are involved in governance and who govern in more than one context
- allow the Department for Education (DfE) to be able to uniquely identify an individual and in a small number of cases conduct checks to confirm their suitability for this important and influential role

Data collection requirements

Some of these personal data items are not publicly available and are encrypted within the GIAS system. Access is restricted to authorised Department for Education (DfE) and education establishment users with a Department for Education (DfE) Sign-in (DSI) account who need to see it in order to fulfil their official duties. The information is for internal purposes only and not shared beyond the Department for Education (DfE) unless the law allows it.

How to find out what personal information the Department for Education (DfE) hold about you

Under the terms of the <u>Data Protection Act 2018</u>, you're entitled to ask the Department for Education (DfE):

- if they are processing your personal data
- for a description of the data, they hold about you
- the reasons they're holding it and any recipient it may be disclosed to
- for a copy of your personal data and any details of its source
